

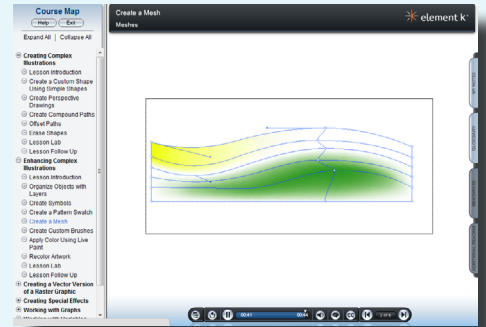
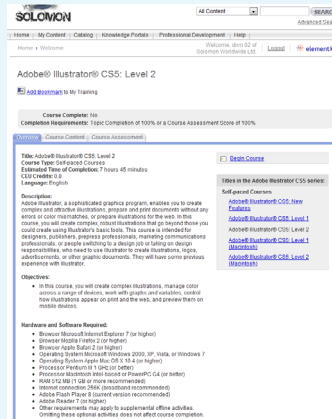

Element K e-learning : Design and Media

The Library has subscribed Element K e-learning which provides series of self-paced courses, Brainbench exams and online books. Users can learn how to design printed materials and Web sites, user interfaces and navigation tools, create multimedia applications and presentations, and edit graphics, video, audio and animation. By completing the Brainbench exams, you can validate your subject area knowledge to yourself and to your employer.



Local TV Programme: Wenzhou Train Collision (溫州列車相撞事故)

On 23 July 2011, two high-speed trains travelling on the Yongtaiwan railway line (甬台溫鐵路) collided on a viaduct in the suburbs of Wenzhou, Zhejiang Province, China. The two trains derailed each other, and four cars fell off the viaduct. At least 39 people were killed, 192 were injured, 12 of which were severe injuries.

Chinese authorities face growing public fury over the high-speed train crash with the disposal of wreckage and attempts to control coverage of the incident prompting allegations of a cover-up.

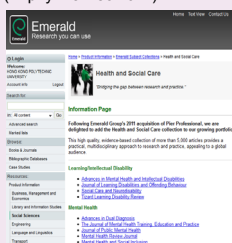

(Expiry: 31 Dec 2011)



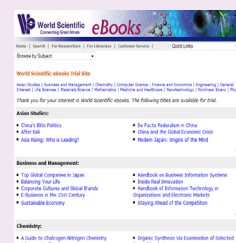
