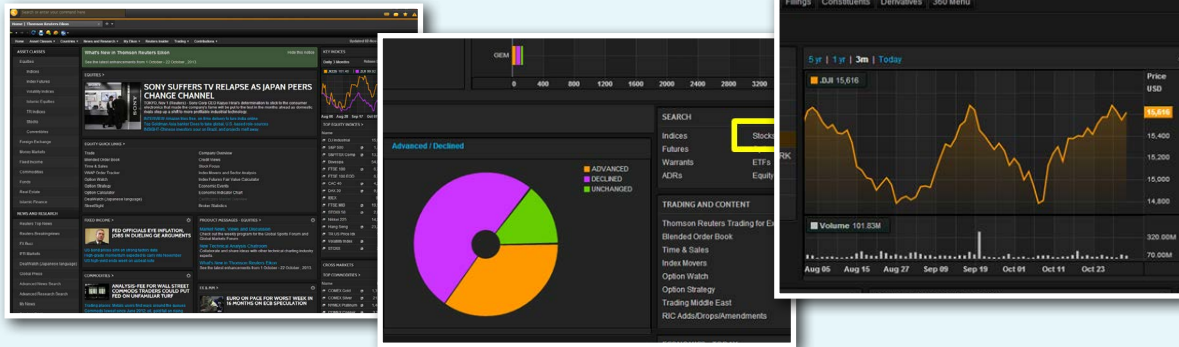

### The New Economics 101: True Wealth in the New Economy

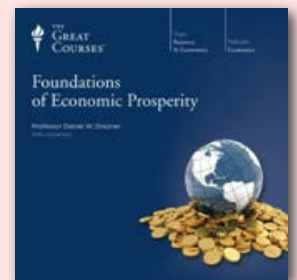
