

#### • Due Date Slip

#### • Media Services Group Discussion Rooms

#### **IT SERVICES**

#### • PC Provision and Printing Service in the Library

The Library continues to enhance the IT services and provision to meet your needs. Various computing equipment and printing services have been upgraded in the past few months. We hope you will find them helpful to your study and research.

#### **\*** User PC Upgrade

All 32 standing express workstations for quick information search have been upgraded with new notebook PCs over the summer. 40 PCs in Library User Education Room (L017) and 42 PCs in Media Services as well as 14 PCs in G/F 24-hour Study Centre have been upgraded with either new notebooks or all-in-one PCs.

#### **\*** More Multipurpose PCs

Quite a number of PCs in the Library are now installed with MS Office applications, various web browsers and plug-ins to support different use purposes, such as information search, web navigation, Word/Excel file editing, etc.

### • Nursing Education in Video

Nursing Education in Video is a unique online collection of videos created specifically for the education and training of nurses, nursing assistants, and other healthcare workers. All of the videos in the collection have been created with the guidance of the Medcom-Trainex advisory board, and are regularly reviewed for accuracy, currency, and compliance with US Federal regulations from agencies such as OSHA and CMS.

The video database provides fully searchable transcripts running alongside the video; There are 11 basic indexing fields, such as author, transcript, discipline, subject, type, language, and year released; You can make video clips and create playlists for course or individual use; The videos can be watched on your Android or Apple tablet or phone. #### **\*** Active Reading



Active Reading intelligently integrates reading with other skills. A text on fashion leads on to an activity where learners create their own advertisement for a watch; a unit on recipes takes students online to research recipes from different countries. This means speaking and writing are key ingredients in each unit. And learners can listen to a range of native speakers reading the texts, helping them to identify sense groups and develop their chunking skills.

#### **\*** Clear Pronunciation



Helps learners recognise and pronounce 43 English phonemes; vowels, consonants and diphthongs. The program includes over 1,000 audio clips and 50 videos which provide both comprehensive input for the sounds, and models for learners to copy. The Recorder enables users to record their voice and assess their pronunciation against a native speaker.

#### \* English for Hotel Staff



A multimedia ESP course designed to provide a course of interactive materials for staff in the hotel industry who wish to improve and upgrade their specialist English language skills, or for students preparing for hotel employment.

#### **\*** Customer Service Communication Skills



Help learners develop skills in listening, soft skills, grammar, pronunciation and reading. Each of these skills relates to communication needs in a customer service environment. Learners have the opportunity to practice combining the skills they have learned as they record and play back their own responses to customer queries. Each unit of work is based around an authentic customer service interaction and is focused on a specific skill (such as "Active Listening" or "Giving Clear Explanations").

#### • Privileges of Postgraduate Students and Researchers



#### \* Interlibrary Loan and Document Delivery Services (ILL)

ILL provides teaching, learning and research support to the PolyU community by borrowing literature that are not held in the PolyU Library collections. Eligible users can login at Online Interlibrary Loan System and submit the requests on a quota basis. We'll send you email notification for picking up or online viewing the requested items in details.

#### \* Information Consultancy Service

To empower teaching/research staff and students to navigate in the world of knowledge, our Faculty/Schools Librarians can help you to identify electronic and printed resources for your needs. We will also help you to make strategic use of the relevant resources of your area of research and introduce you to the state-of-the-art bibliographic and reference tools.

#### \* Using UGC-funded Libraries - JULAC Library Card

UGC-funded and PolyU's self-funded postgraduate degree, UGC-funded postgraduate non-degree students, as well as the full-time teaching, research and administrative staff may obtain a Joint University Librarians Advisory Committee (JULAC) Library Card for admittance to the other UGC-funded libraries and borrow books. Applications should be made at the Circulation Counter (P/F). Books borrowed by PolyU JULAC cardholders from other UGC-funded libraries can be returned at the Circulation Counter on or before the due date.

#### • Tools for Evaluating Journals

#### \* Journal Citation Reports (JCR)

Published by the Institute for Scientific Information annually, the Journal Citation Reports provide systematic and objective means of determining the relative importance of science and social sciences journals within their subject categories. For Science Edition, it includes topics from Agriculture to Zoology and contains citation data on nearly 5,000 leading science journals. For Social Science Edition, it includes topics from Anthropology



to Women's Studies and contains citation data on approximately 1,700 leading social sciences journals.

The JCR can tell you:

- the total number of times that each journal has been cited in a given year (Total Cites)
- the frequency with which the average article in a journal has been cited in a particular year (Impact Factor)
- how quickly the average article in a specific journal is cited (Immediacy Index)
- the number of articles published in the year of coverage (Articles)
- the ongoing use of a particular journal (Cited Half-life)

#### \* SCImago Journal Rank (SJR)

SCImago Journal Rank is a journal analyzer provided by Scopus. It

- is weighted by the prestige of the journal, thereby 'leveling the playing field' among journals
- eliminates manipulation: raise the SJR ranking by being published in more reputable journals
- 'shares' a journal's prestige equally over the total number of citations in that journal
- normalizes for differences in citation behavior between subject fields

#### \* Source Normalized Impact per Paper (SNIP)

Source Normalized Impact per Paper is also a journal analyzer provided by Scopus. It

- measures contextual citation impact by 'normalizing' citation values
- takes a research field's citation frequency into account
- considers immediacy how quickly a paper is likely to have an impact in a given field
- accounts for how well the field is covered by the underlying database
- calculates without use of a journal's subject classification to avoid delimitation
- counters any potential for editorial manipulation








#### REVITALIZATION
